## Section 4. First aid measures

#### **Description of necessary first aid measures**

### **Eye contact**

#### Inhalation

# Specific hazards arising from the chemical

Extremely flammable aerosol. Runoff to sewer may create fire or explosion hazard. #### Large spill
